Every journey has a beginning, a middle and an end. As President of the Kiwanis Club of Hacienda Heights, my journey was no different. It started off in October 2012 with an installation that broke tradition. Rather than a small club event, we invited the community and had over 300 in attendance with entertainment and food prepared by students in our local schools. This was one of the largest installation ceremonies ever hosted in Division 35 and a great start for our year ahead.

Following are just a few highlights for our club this year. The Pro Rodeo, the Buckboard Days Pancake Breakfast and chaperoning

multiple SLP events followed. The Field of Valor and the Boys and Girls Club Thanksgiving dinner and turkey give-a-way came next. We had the Rose Float feeding, annual holiday social and toy drive and the YMCA Turkey Trot. February was an especially successful month for us with our annual Ribfest and our Third annual Heart and Sole event for Shoes That Fit. Honoring our Veterans at Rose Hills "Welcome Home Vets" and Kiwanis One Day at the YMCA, Blankets of Love, and the granting of scholarships to local school clubs followed. The Watershed Restoration, workday at Delhaven, military boxes and ELIMINATE fundraising at Taste of Heights came next. Scholarships were given out to seven students in HLPUSD and three to Regional Occupational Program.

We completed the "I Love America Parade", sold fireworks at our Fireworks Stand, and had a successful Stuff-A-Bus to collect school supplies for our local

schools. We continued to support Haddicks and Industry Sherriff's Youth Foundation and Boys and Girls Club Family Fun Night.

We sponsored seven SLP clubs, including an Aktion Club at Delhaven. We are now in the process of bringing another Builders Club back on line at Newton. We continued our monthly Adopt-A-Highway, donations to Children Hospital and Relay for Life and sponsored Key Leader as well as chaperoning on a weekly basis events coordinated by our SLP. **None of these accomplishments could have occurred without the support of our membership, our SLP and the communities we serve.**

We finished the year financially sound, raising more money than expected and spending in accordance with the budget submitted at the beginning of the year. Our name recognition was enhanced in the community through membership in the Greater San Gabriel

Poor weather may cause cancellation of an event. Call (626) 443-2297 and press #223 anytime after 5:00 pm the day before an event to verify event status.

REMEMBER TO:

- Bring a snack and drinking water.
- Must have own transportation for duration of event: dropping off attendees and leaving them without transportation during the event is not permitted.
- Start with a full gas tank. During the event participants are usually directed to drive from the meeting area to a different location further up Azusa Canyon.
- Consider bringing work or garden gloves.
- The drive along Highway 39 is on typical mountain terrain which means that during some portions of the drive there are twists, sharp curves, and narrow lanes.
- Dress in comfortable clothes that are safe and appropriate for working outdoors in the mountains. Bring a jacket since weather may get cold. Sunscreen and hats are also suggested.
- Wear sturdy, non-skid, closed-toe shoes (*sneakers, hiking boots, etc.*).
